**FORM** Eye drops 0.5% (Minims and 5ml bottle)

**INDICATION** Retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) screening.

Post Laser Eye Surgery (in conjunction with prednisolone)

1. ROP Screening (Pre examination drops)

See ROP Protocol	One drop into both eyes	As per local ROP protocol	Topical to eyes
Followed by	One drop into both eyes	As per local ROP protocol	Topical to eyes

2. Post Laser Eye Surgery (in conjunction with prednisolone)

AGE	DOSE	FREQUENCY	ROUTE
All ages	One drop into affected eyes	EIGHT hourly for 14 days	Topical to eyes

- Phenylephrine 2.5% eye drops also require to be given as part of the ROP protocol. See phenylephrine entry for details.
- Give cyclopentolate before phenylephrine
- Caution should be exercised to avoid overdosage as toxic systemic reactions to cyclopentolate may occur in young babies
