**INDICATION** Treatment of hyperammonaemia

PRESCRIPTION OF 1g in 20ml infusion fluid

**CONTINUOUS INFUSION** This gives;

• 10 mg/kg/hr = 0.2 ml/kg/hr

**RECONSTITUTION** Already in solution

Sodium Benzoate 200mg/ml 5ml
Glucose 10% Up to 20ml total

Gives a 50mg in 1ml solution. Use the required volume.

METHOD OF Loading Dose

ADMINISTRATION

5 x weight (kg) = number of mL of diluted solution (50mg/ml) to be

infused over 90 minutes

Continuous Infusion

By continuous intravenous infusion, flow rate adjusted according to

response.
