INDICATION Acute hyperammonaemia due to urea cycle disorders

DOSE RANGE

NB. Treatment should not be initiated without consultation with a metabolic specialist.

0 – 6 months	250mg/kg	Loading dose	IV

PRESCRIPTION OF CONTINUOUS INFUSION

1g in 20ml infusion fluid

This gives;

• 10 mg/kg/hr = 0.2 ml/kg/hr

RECONSTITUTION Already in solution.

DILUTION

Sodium Phenylbutyrate 200mg/ml 5ml
Glucose 10% Up to 20ml total

Gives a 50mg in 1ml solution. Use the required volume.

METHOD OF ADMINISTRATION

Loading Dose

5 x weight (kg) = number of mL of diluted solutions (50mg/ml) to be

infused over 90 minutes

Continuous Infusion

By continuous intravenous infusion, flow rate adjusted according to

response.
