INDICATION Prophylaxis of HIV infection in newborn infants – as part of combination

therapy.

DOSE RANGE

AGE	DOSE	FREQUENCY	ROUTE
Neonate	4.9 mg/kg/dose *(0.49 ml/kg of 10mg/ml dilution)	ONCE daily for 4 weeks	Oral

Round dose up to the nearest 0.5mg (<10mg) or 1mg (≥ 10mg) to assist administration.

Additional dosage information

* For all doses use a 245mg Tenofovir Disoproxil tablet dissolved in 24.5ml of water giving a final concentration of 10mg per ml.

Put one tablet into 24.5ml of water and allow to disintegrate - this may

take several minutes.

Once mixed, measure the recommended volume of suspension with a

syringe and administer the dose orally.

The dose should be administered orally immediately following

preparation. Discard remainder.

 If the baby is vomiting there should be early recourse to intravenous therapy
