RECONSTITUTION 1. Reconstitute the 40mg vial with 5ml sodium chloride 0.9% to give an

8mg/ml solution.

2. Mix thoroughly making sure all omeprazole has dissolved.

DILUTION

Omeprazole 8mg/ml solution 1ml
Sodium chloride 0.9% Up to 20ml

Gives a 0.4mg in 1ml solution. Use the required volume.

METHOD OF ADMINISTRATION

Administer the required volume of diluted solution over 20 - 30 minutes.
