Gives Ca²⁺ 1mmol in 1ml solution. Use the required volume

Note displacement value of 0.5ml

Allow tablet to disperse fully and stop fizzing before measuring dose.

FURTHER INFORMATION Calcium doses should not be prescribed at the same time as phosphate

or iron supplements as this can affect absorption

High doses of Calcium may cause constipation.
